**Subject Matter:** Bible. God's Wrath. Obedience.

## Luke 20

**9** And he began to tell the people this parable: "A man planted a vineyard and let it out to tenants and went into another country for a long while. **10** When the time came, he sent a servant to the tenants, so that they would give him some of the fruit of the vineyard. But the tenants beat him and sent him away empty-handed.

**11** And he sent another servant. But they also beat and treated him

shamefully, and sent him away empty-handed. **12**

And he sent yet a third.

This one also they wounded and cast out. **13**

Then the owner of the vineyard said, 'What shall I do? I will send my beloved son; perhaps they will respect him.' **14** But when the tenants saw him, they

said to themselves, 'This is the heir. Let us kill him, so that the inheritance may be ours.' **15** And they threw

him out of the vineyard and killed him. What then will the owner of the vineyard

do to them? **16** He will come and destroy those tenants and give the

vineyard to others." When they heard this, they said, "Surely not!" **17** But he

looked directly at them and said, "What then is this that is written: " 'The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone'?"

**18** Everyone who falls on that stone will be broken to pieces, and when it falls on anyone, it will crush him."

1. Read **Matthew 7:24-29**. What are some of the “this life” benefits you have experienced by putting the preaching of God’s Word into practice?
2. Read **Ezekiel 33:29-33**. What specific steps can you take to keep from simply “liking sermons” or “enjoying time in the Word” to diligently moving on to put those truths into action?
3. Read **Hebrews 6:7-12**. If the writer of Hebrews feels “sure of better things” (i.e., that most of his original readers were actually saved - v.9), then what use do you think it was to bring the stern and bleak warning found in vv.7-8?
4. Read **Revelation 20:11-15**. What are some of the motivations you derive by reading of the serious consequences of others rejecting Christ (assuming that you do not)?
5. Read **Ephesians 4:30**. Why should we care so much about grieving the Holy Spirit as Christians? What sorts of things do you know have grieved Him in your life?
