## Luke 22

**7** Then came the day of Unleavened Bread, on which the Passover lamb had to be sacrificed. **8** So Jesus sent Peter and John, saying, "Go and prepare the Passover for us, that we may eat it." **9** They said to him, "Where will you have us prepare it?" **10** He said to them, "Behold, when you have entered the city, a man carrying a jar of water will meet you. Follow him into the house that he enters **11** and tell the master of the house, 'The Teacher says to you, Where is the guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?' **12** And he will show you a large upper room furnished; prepare it there." **13** And they went and found it just as he had told them, and they prepared the Passover.

## APPLICATION QUESTIONS

1. Read **John 1:29**; **1 Peter 1:18-19** and **Revelation 5:11-14**. Why is the picture of Christ as a lamb such an important analogy? What does that image do to enhance your love, appreciation, and worship of Jesus Christ?
2. Read **1 Corinthians 5:6-8**. How should the concern for the absence of leaven in the Passover motivate you to be holy? What are some specific temptations that you think would qualify for the description in verse 8?
3. Read **Romans 6:12-23**. The Passover was a reminder of the redemption of the children of Israel from their physical enslavement in Egypt. How can that image give you a greater resolve to live for Christ in light of this passage in Romans?
4. Read **John 1:47-51**. Why is it important to always remember that Jesus Christ is the all-knowing, all-powerful Lord of lords? What is at stake when we think of Jesus in a casual or less-than-divine way?
5. Read **Hebrews 1:1-3**. What are some of the reasons Christ's deity is so essential for our confidence in the salvation and forgiveness granted to us by His sacrifice?
